Our Self-Evaluation Report and Improvement Plan 2017-2018

1. Introduction

This document records the outcomes of our last improvement plan, the findings of this self-evaluation, and our current improvement plan, including targets and the actions we will implement to meet the targets.

1.1 Outcomes of our last improvement plan from [September 2017] to [May 2018]

Literacy

- Staff have undergone training with the NBSS and have completed courses in VEP & CatchUp Literacy.
- Introduction of new programmes such as CSI and Rapid Plus.
- Paired reading has been very successful between TY and 1st years.
- Our annual Literacy drive was pared back to only take place during Tutorial time this will be changed to a whole school daily strategy from next year.
- A lot of resources were put into the completion of our new school library.

Numeracy

- Most of the staff has included numeracy elements to their subject plans
- We have been successful with our yearly numeracy drive and we have successfully engaged 100% of our students in our Numeracy related activities in the school.
- Introduction of Numeracy Ninjas.
- Introduction of paired Maths

E-Learning

- The use of Chromebooks have been rolled out throughout the school.
- Computer Club takes place weekly with WorkDay.
- The expansion of the use of GoogleClass room.
- CDP led by staff to help reluctant colleagues.

1.2 The focus of this evaluation

We decided to improve literacy levels by improving students' attitudes towards reading in St. Vincent's during the period (*September 2017*) to (*May 2018*). We evaluated the following aspect(s) of literacy:

Literacy

- Attitude towards Reading.
- Fully functional library.
- Annual literacy drive.
- Improved literacy interventions.

Numeracy

- We plan to improve the numeracy and the students enjoyment of numbers through the process of SSE this year
- Continue with numeracy drive and trying to have all students in our school experience numeracy during the course of the year.

E-Learning

- Upgrade infrastructure of school in relation to E-Learning.
- New equipment to allow students to use Chromebooks in class.
- CDP for staff led by staff.

Planning Stage

We decided to plan for improvement of Homework, both in our policy and implementation. We are gathering data through surveys of staff and students.





2. Findings

2.1 This is effective / very effective practice in our school

- Literacy due to the loss of days this year, we cut back the Literacy Drive, it was therefore not as effective.
- More trained teachers are implementing new programmes CSI, Rapid Plus, catch up.

2.2. This is how we know

- Students were asking teachers about the books displayed on the walls which demonstrated their interest levels in reading for enjoyment.
- Both debating and the Public Speaking Competition were very successful. Students expressed their enjoyment of both aspects and want them to continue next year.
- Students and teachers felt the Paired-Reading initiative worked well and will continue next year.

2.3 This is what we are going to focus on to improve our practice further

- Encourage reading for enjoyment by using the new library and the mini-libraries within teacher-based classrooms.
- Extend practice of oral presentation by increasing the number of literacy events throughout the year for juniors Public Speaking Competition, Halloween Creative Writing Recital, Valentine's Day Poetry Reading and a Spelling Bee.
- Debating will be extended to accommodate Junior Cycle students and entry into national competitions will be encouraged.
- Spelling and grammar checklists made available to students in order for them to self-assess work.
